TSCA COMPLIANCE STATEMENT

Regulation of Persistent, Bioaccumulative, and Toxic Chemicals Under TSCA Section 6(h)

This Lake Shore Cryotronics Inc. TSCA Compliance Declaration applies to all products sold by Lake Shore Cryotronics Inc., according to the definitions and restrictions given for the Persistent, Bioaccumulative, and Toxic chemicals under TSCA Section 6(h).

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), as required under the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA), published five final rules to reduce exposure to certain chemicals that are Persistent, Bioaccumulative, and Toxic (PBT). The final rules for each of the five PBTs took effect on February 5, 2021. In October 2024, EPA issued a final rule amending the rules for decabromodiphenyl (decaBDE) and phenol, isopropylated phosphate (3:1) PIP (3:1) effective January 21, 2025.

TSCA addresses the production, importation, use, and disposal of specific chemicals including polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs), asbestos, radon, and lead-based paint.

Lake Shore Cryotronics Inc., based on the information received by our suppliers and the best of our knowledge, declares that our products do not contain any of the five PBTs above the legal threshold limits. Some of our products are proprietary, and suppliers may choose not to reveal all ingredients. Lake Shore Cryotronics Inc, therefore, makes no warranties, expressed or implied, and assumes no liability in connection with the accuracy of this information.
